## RR Worker Letter Home

The year is 1868, the Transcontinental Railroad has been under construction for several years now, and you are a veteran railroad worker. Central Pacific crews were typically Irish Americans or African American's working from the central of the United States across the plains of the Midwest - facing discrimination, native attacks, and harsh working conditions. Meanwhile, Union Pacfic Railroad worked from the East Coast: California to Uhtah. Typically, these Chinese Immigrants faced less native attacks, but harsh working conditions in the heat, and the dense Rocky Mountains made work equally difficult. Crews faced making several inches of progress a day until they broke the Rocky Mountains, where they suddenly were able to make upwards of 10 miles a day. Your goal is to write 2 letters home, one from each side of the Transcontinental Railroad describing what a day-in-the-life is like as a railroad worker. You must write one letter home from the Central Pacfic and Union Pacific (2 letters total, making up at least 6 sentences). Make up names for yourself, be respectful, historically accurate, and try to cover details that we covered in class about daily life, and what conditions are like.
