<p><b>Read a book!</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• With a flashlight</li><li>• Using a silly voice</li><li>• With a stuffed animal</li><li>• Outside</li><li>• In a fort/tent</li><li>• In your pajamas</li><li>• To your pet</li><li>• To your grandparent</li></ul>	<p><b>Make a Book!</b></p> <p>Staple pages together to make the book and then use words and pictures to make a story.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Alphabet book or counting book</li><li>• Animal book</li><li>• Summer bucket list</li><li>• Write a list of books you read</li><li>• Write about something you like</li></ul>	<p><b>Rainbow Colors!</b></p> <p>Write/make sight words, words, your name, and letters using rainbow colors.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Chalk</li><li>• Crayons</li><li>• Markers</li><li>• Paint</li><li>• Playdough</li><li>• Window markers</li></ul>
<p><b>Alphabet Scavenger Hunt!</b></p> <p>Find things that begin with each letter of the alphabet!</p> <p>Some examples:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>a- apple</li><li>r- rabbit</li><li>S- squirrel</li><li>t- tree</li></ul>	<p><b>Play “I-Spy”</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Rhyming “I-Spy” (I-spy something that rhymes with bee)</li><li>• Beginning sound “I Spy” (I-spy something that begins with f- flower)</li><li>• Syllable “I-Spy” (I-spy something that has 3 syllables- butterfly)</li><li>• Ending sound “I-Spy” (I-Spy something that ends with d- cloud)</li></ul>	<p><b>Sight Word Practice-</b> all 50 kindergarten sight words</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Play sight word hopscotch</li><li>• Write words on post its. Stick them to a wall or door: try to hit them with a ball, fly swatter, bean bag, or nerf dart as you read them.</li><li>• Use magnetic letters to spell the words</li><li>• Build sight word tower by writing names on cups and reading words as you stack them or cup toss</li></ul>
<p><b>Book Talks!</b></p> <p>Write the following words on popsicle sticks- character, setting, beginning, middle, end, problem, and solution. When finished reading, choice 1-2 sticks to help retell your story!</p>	<p><b>Be an Author!</b></p> <p>Keep working on writing true stories from your life. Each page should tell one part of the story (beginning, middle, end). Edit with a checklist: capital letter to start your sentence, finger spaces, and punctuation.</p>	<p><b>Book Talks!</b></p> <p>Discuss good books that you read: talk about main idea and supporting details, sequence of events, making inferences, using fix up strategies (like rereading and picture clues), making predictions, setting a purpose for reading, and comparing/contrasting ideas.</p>
