




# **Durham Nockamixon Elementary School**

#### How are we implementing PBIS at our school in Tier I?

The Tiered Fidelity Inventory (our PBIS assessment) indicates that we are implementing Tier I above benchmark, at 100%. Additionally, Durham Nockamixon has been named a No Place for Hate School for the 3<sup>rd</sup> year in a row!





# How do we use Office Discipline Referral data?

Schoolwide data is reviewed regularly throughout the year. This year's data report shows that a multi-tiered system of support (MTSS) is in place, with approximately 80% of the student population (green) reaching success within our SWPBIS Tier I system. The top portion of the visual shows that approximately 15% of students (yellow) and 5% of students (red) are demonstrating a need for advanced tier interventions. This graph demonstrates that a preventative and proactive framework is in place to meet the needs of each student.

### How are we implementing PBIS at our school in Tier II?

Our TFI score indicates that we are implementing Tier II interventions at 81%, which is an 8% increase from our first year! These interventions are provided to students needing additional support. Current interventions include:

- → Bulldog Buddies (Check In/Check Out): 85% of our students met or surpassed their daily goal of 80%
- → Counseling groups: We ran 10 groups this year with focuses on social skills, friendship skills, self regulation, self esteem, anxiety management and building confidence
- → Big Brothers Big Sisters of Bucks County: This is our first full year implementing this intervention and we were able to match 15 DN students with a high school mentor

#### How is our attendance?

Last Year: 96.7% This Year: 94.7%
